How to apply for TMCF Scholarships?

There are so many scholarship opportunities for students like you to apply for. In order to do so you must create a TMCF account.

1. All students interested in applying for TMCF opportunities must visit: apply.tmcf.org.
2. A TMCF account allows you to apply for scholarships, internships, full-time jobs and other opportunities offered by TMCF partners.
3. Once you create your account, TMCF will collect basic information from you so they can offer the most relevant opportunities. Once you have completed the basic information form, you can search the system for applications and apply to those that are interesting or relevant to you.

How to create a TMCF Account:

A Step-by-step Guide

1. First, visit: apply.tmcf.org.
2. Second, under "Need an Account?" Click: sign up.
3. Third, fill out basic information about yourself (i.e., first and last name, email address).

Please use a personal email address (not .edu) when registering.
4. Then, once you sign up, you will need to check your personal email for an account activation link. You should receive the email within a couple of minutes.
5. Once you have created an account, the first step once you have created your TMCF Account is completing the Basic Information Form. Once you have completed the form, you will be able to apply to opportunities in the system.
6. Finally, once that step is completed, on the home page, click on APPLICATION (on the top left side of the website). Scroll down and click VIEW APPLICATIONS. There, you will find all the available scholarships that matched your profile & APPLY button next to them (open date and deadline).

2020-2021 TMCF COVID-19 Emergency Award

Description: The Thurgood Marshall College Fund (TMCF) and varying partners are proud to offer COVID-19 emergency financial assistance to students attending one of TMCF's 47 publicly-supported Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) or Predominantly Black Institutions (PBIs). Students selected will receive an emergency award of up to \$1,000 for the 2020-2021 academic school year. Funding is intended to allow students to meet their needs and continue their education. Funding is available until the funds are exhausted or until the end of the summer term 2021, whichever comes first.

TMCF will only consider requests to cover expenses in five areas:

- IT/Technology Needs. For example, laptop, Wi-Fi hotspot, access codes for e-books.
- Housing/Rent Needs. For example, mortgage, rent, utility bills
- Food Insecurity Needs. For example, groceries.
- Transportation/Travel Needs. For example, gas, car repairs, train/bus/plane tickets, moving support.
- Mental Health. For example, copays for therapist appointments

Eligibility:

- Be enrolled full-time as a freshman, sophomore, junior or senior undergraduate at a TMCF member-school during the 2020-2021 academic school year. (York College is a TMCF member-school and a Predominantly Black Institution (PBI)).
- Current cumulative grade point average of 2.7 or higher.
- Be a U.S. Citizen or legal permanent resident with a valid permanent resident card or passport stamped I-551.

In addition, all Applicants Must:

- Be verified as an eligible candidate by your college/university.
- Upload either: Receipts for expenses or invoices for items needing to be purchased in the four expense areas listed in the overview.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: This application will be open until funds are exhausted or the end of spring term 2021, whichever comes first.

2020-21 TMCF — Leadership Institute

The Leadership Institute (LI) is an exciting four-day leadership development conference, usually held annually in October, for college juniors, seniors, and graduate and law students attending HBCUs and PBIs. Exceptionally strong sophomores are also encouraged to apply. LI is for students who establish themselves as leaders, as well as students with leadership potential who want to build on their skill sets. Prior leadership roles in high school or college are preferred. However, a desire to develop personal leadership and professional advancement skills is required.

Leadership Institute (LI) Objectives:

- Students with relevant & valuable information.
 - Skills through challenging & information sessions.
 - Success from testimonies by real-life role models.
 - Students to employment opportunities with leading employers.

- Each year, the conference gives students attending the 47 publicly-supported Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), including the law and medical schools, a first-hand professional development experience.
 - Students are interviewed during the spring and fall semesters, and those selected as “TMCF Scholars” will attend a four-day conference in Washington, D.C., where they will have the opportunity to learn from and exchange ideas with some of the world’s top leaders of business and government.
 - The conference culminates with the students participating in a recruitment fair where they meet with companies, government agencies and graduate program representatives offering job, internship and continuing education opportunities. Successful leaders of industry, government and higher education invest in their education, further developing their talents. The secrets to developing professional skills and leadership are unearthed at this conference.
